It also seemed the door decorating craze we observed on the Dream had caught on at EPCOT. Here are the doors of the Exit and Enter families.




And now, today's highlight #1: Forget cupcakes, pretzels, turkey legs, and Mickey Bars. Here is the best thing EVER!

Upon leaving EPCOT, we left our car in the EPCOT lot and took the monorail to the TTC. We transferred to the MK resort loop and started an abbreviated monorail crawl to check out the Christmas decorations at the three MK resorts. First stop was at the Poly where we decided to have a libation in the lounge in homage to MrHub & Scrappy. We followed this with libation-less stop at the GF. We skipped the CR because we were coming back later to hit the Cali Grill.













It was getting close to 7PM, when we transferred back to the EPCOT monorail loop and retrieved our rental car from the EPCOT parking lot. We exited the parking lot and got onto EPCOT Center Drive heading east. We took the first exit onto Backstage Lane (this is one way to meet members of the security team) and then a left onto Overpass Road. At the intersection of Bonnet Creek Parkway we turned left and proceeded north past Port Orleans. We then turned left onto Vista Boulevard past FW, turned right on World Drive, and right again onto Timberline Drive into the WL parking lot.

After a quick shower and a change into some nicer casual duds, we drove to the CR. The turn-by-turn directions consisted of a right hander onto World Drive and another into the CR parking lot. We parked and went up to the second floor to check in for our 9:30 ADR and the Cali Grill.

This was our second visit to the California Grill, but the first since the renovations and general changes to the restaurant. We each had a beer at the small tables near the windows while we waited for our table. This gave us a chance to check out the new décor. We both really liked it, although we liked the old décor too. Just as we finished our beer our waiter greeted us and escorted us to our table.

We had researched the menu before the trip in anticipation of having another top-ten dinner at the top of WDW, so we knew what we wanted. NHShorty ordered a bottle of Sequoia Grove Cabernet Sauvignon for us. We started with the Sonoma Goat Cheese Ravioli, which we shared, followed by Baby Romaine Salads with Roasted Garlic Dressing. For our main course we each ordered the Oak-fired Filet of Beef cooked medium. Sadly, here is today's highlight 3#, NHShorty's steak arrived cooked well done and had to be sent back. Normally this is not a big deal, but we sort of expected better. It was so obviously overcooked and should have never been served.






The service seemed much more casual this time, our waiter was covering four tables and just didn't seem to have time to really pay attention to anyone. Pointing out to our waiter that NHShorty's steak was overcooked seemed to be more of a problem than I expected. It just wasn't the level of service we expected. Even the wait staff uniforms seen to have taken a step down from what we had seen before and that seemed to set the tone for the experience.

Maybe our expectations were set too high by our previous visit and our great experience at Palo a few days prior on the Dream. We plan to give the CG a rest for a while and try some new places including the Yachtsman Steakhouse on our next visit in May.

After dinner we jumped on the monorail and headed to MK around 11:30 for EMH. We stayed at the MK until 02:15AM when we both ran out of gas.
